

CYCN APRIL REPORT

Date: May 12, 2021

SUMMARY:

The CYCN through National Chapters executed its first set of projects with the CYCN's Earth Day webinar (in collaboration with One Better World Collective, Canada and EYI Africa) being a major highlight. The selection of Committee Chairs was completed and the CYCN Toolkit was made available to all members of the executive.

- Secured Partnership with EYI Africa, One Better World Collective and Aquaworld.

CYCN Fiji

CYCN Trinidad and Tobago

- Composed letter to regional manufacturer to ensure green procurement of RSPOcertified palm oil and established partnership for projects.

CYCN Ghana

CYCN Bahamas

- 181 coastal plants were planted ranging from mangroves to sea grape trees.
- Beach clean-up removed large amounts of trash from area.
- Trash was tallied for an ongoing project conducted by a separate environmental organization in the Bahamas.

HIGHLIGHTS:

CYCN Belize

The CYCN members in Belize have been engaged on Earth Day events all month long with local youth organizations and NGOs. Many of the activities include building the awareness of climate change impacts on community livelihoods whilst building the stewardship of environmental protection and restoration along the coast of Belize. CYCN members carried out their community projects with the support of volunteers in each community. The CYCN in Belize has

officially reached out to representatives in climate change-related project but have intension to contributing towards a strategy plan to engage youth in policymaking.

CYCN Cameroon

At the National level, we have planted 50 trees in 1 community school, Education of 20 kids on Environmental practices. 15 letters of collaboration to support CYCN actions in Cameroon have been distributed. Community Clean up. We designed a flyer shared on social media platforms to encourage calls for membership at the Cameroonian level. Further, a ted talk on Environmental education and awareness has been carried out in a 1-week workshop to encourage participants to join the course on protecting Mother Nature.

CYCN St. Lucia

During this month, we engaged various youth organizations including youth-led environmental organizations on island including:

- St. Lucia National Youth Council and District Youth Councils
- Caribbean Youth Environmental Network St. Lucia Chapter (CYEN)

We created a flyer and FAQs PDF document that was circulated on various social media platforms to create awareness. We are expecting our membership to increase during this month due to the engagements and advocacy of the organization.

CYCN India

We are trying to increase our base and spread a word. There are very few members participating in CYCN India. We still arranged an induction session on 25th April, 2021 where 6 people including us joined. We would want to produce position papers and collaborate with think tankers and academicians.

CYCN Jamaica

The Earth Day Forum was poorly supported and it may be determined that insufficient planning and just poor sportsmanship, this was the cause. I hope moving forward that it can be bigger and better and more support can be given by CYCN members.

For May and onward CYCN Jamaica will be focusing on building partnerships and expansion.

CYCN Nigeria

The Commonwealth Youth Climate Change Network (CYCN) Nigeria chapter during the course of the Month (April) embarked on several activities and projects. The month of April's major highlight was the Earth Day week. Other highlights included: CYCN membership growth and retention campaign, the Campus Ambassador project, Celebration of international events and members birthday, CYCN Earth Day webinar (in collaboration with One Better World Collective, Canada and EYI Africa).

CYCN Fiji

A successful National Committee meeting was conducted after which the planning was in motion for the upcoming activities such as the fundraising raffle draw and teambuilding activities for the network. A week before the raffle ticket draw, new Covid19 cases made an outbreak in our community due to which the whole nation is in lockdown. Due to the restrictions imposed by the Government to contain the virus, all the CYCN network activities have been hosted online. This is in line with the Governments restrictions for everyone's safety. Currently, the committee members are working on how to organize activities online to engage members.

CYCN Trinidad and Tobago

May project was completed. Planning for October project continued. Outreach for July/November project began.

CYCN Ghana

Ghana CYCN are yet to receive member-list in order to roll-out plans set for 2021. We have initiated a conversation with the Marine and Fisheries Students Association at the University of Ghana. This is set to contribute to CYCN membership and the Tertiary Institution Partnerships initiative.

CYCN Bahamas

On April 24th members of CYCN Bahamas participated in a Beach Clean-up and Tree Planting event organized by different sustainability organizations in the Bahamas and volunteers from environmental clubs at the University of the Bahamas. To raise awareness of the importance of pollinators, the threats they face and their contribution to sustainable development, a world bee day panel discussion will be hosted.

This is celebrated on the 21st of May annually. Potential partners include the National Environment and Planning Agency (NEPA). Endangered Species Day is an opportunity for people of all ages to learn about the importance of protecting endangered species and everyday actions they can take to help protect them. A collaboration with NEPA could see a sensitization session being done where some of Jamaica's endangered species are highlighted. For example, certain turtles, Jamaican Boa, Whistling Duck etc.

Celebrated on the 8th of June annually, potential partners include the Jamaica Environment Trust (JET). On World Oceans Day, people around our blue planet celebrate and honour our one global ocean, which connects us all. Get together with your family, friends, community, and the planet to start creating a better future. By working together, we can—and will — protect our shared ocean. Join this growing global celebration on 8th of June with continuing engagement year-round by making a promotional video.

ANNEX 1

Project Proposal

Climate Change is We Business

In November 2021, the United Kingdom will preside over the highly anticipated 26th Conference of the Parties of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change. The typically annual meeting was postponed at the beginning of this consequential decade for action owing to the COVID-19 pandemic.

In 2020, Northeast Tobago earned United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization Man and Biosphere designation. This achievement has been recognized as an opportunity to revitalize its ecotourism.

An international network of scientists, artists, educators and activists are setting up Climate Clocks to highlight the limited time left to prevent global average temperature increase from exceeding 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels - the desired premise of the Paris Agreement on which Small Island Developing States in particular will rely to avoid the worst effects of Climate Change. The first prominent installations of Climate Clocks have been Berlin in 2019 and New York City in 2020. Establishing a Climate Clock in Northeast Tobago in 2021 could commemorate the anniversary of the designation, affirm Trinidad and Tobago's leadership among SIDS advocating for enhanced action to combat Climate Change and underscore the purpose of the UNESCO Man and Biosphere Programme and the intention of the local initiative.

The annual observance of World Tourism Day will occur on the 27th of September and focus on the sector's social, cultural, political and economic service. Tourism is a significant sector in Trinidad and Tobago and the impact of Climate Change will have consequences comparable to the COVID-19 pandemic on vulnerable groups such as women and youth.


Climate Change is We Business aims to mainstream climate action by raising awareness and educating stakeholders. Activities would include:


- 1. An education campaign on the effects of Climate Change and actions that can be taken including:
 - a. Energy and water management
 - b. Food choice and waste management (RSPO-certified palm oil, composting and sustainable packaging).
- 2. Launch a Climate Clock in Northeast Tobago in commemoration of International Day for Climate Action on October 24th to signify the pressing time to act. The education campaign may continue as part of the Tobago House of Assembly Division of Infrastructure, Quarries and the Environment BagoVersity initiative.




